3. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus taught that Christians are to be Salt and Light. In your own words, what do you think Jesus meant by those two metaphors?
4. Jesus expands on being salt by describing if salt loses its taste it would become useless. Now read, John 15:1-8. How are Jesus’ words in Matthew 5 and John 15 connected? What truths can you see in both passages that apply to Christ followers?
5. Pastor Brant showed us from Jesus’ instruction in Matthew 5, that salt has two essential components that are required to be effective or “Highly Contagious” — potency and proximity. What can we learn from this that will help us in our Kingdom assignment of evangelism?
