Part 5: "Resurrection Legacy"

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"One generation shall praise Your works to another, and shall declare
Your mighty acts." — Psalm 145:4 (NKJV)

*"3 I thank God, whom I serve with a pure conscience, as my forefathers did, as without ceasing I remember you in my prayers night and day, 4 greatly desiring to see you, being mindful of your tears, that I may be filled with joy, 5 when I call to remembrance the genuine faith that is in you, which dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice, and I am persuaded is in you also. 6 Therefore I remind you to stir up the gift of God which is in you through the laying on of my hands. 7 For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind."
— 2 Timothy 1:3-7 (NKJV)*

21 Jesus got into the boat again and went back to the other side of the lake, where a large crowd gathered around him on the shore. 22 Then a leader of the local synagogue, whose name was Jairus, arrived. When he saw Jesus, he fell at his feet, 23 pleading fervently with him. "My little daughter is dying," he said. "Please come and lay your hands on her; heal her so she can live."

*40 The crowd laughed at him. But he made them all leave, and he took the girl's father and mother and his three disciples into the room where the girl was lying. 41 Holding her hand, he said to her, "Talitha koum," which means "Little girl, get up!" 42 And the girl, who was twelve years old, immediately stood up and walked around! They were overwhelmed and totally amazed."

3 Markers of Resurrection Legacy

1. Faith is _____

*"when I call to remembrance the genuine faith that is in you, which dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice, and I am persuaded is in you also."
— 2 Timothy 1:5 (NKJV)*

"that the genuineness of your faith, being much more precious than gold that perishes, though it is tested by fire, may be found to praise, honor, and glory at the revelation of Jesus Christ," — 1 Peter 1:7 (NKJV)

"These trials will show that your faith is genuine. It is being tested as fire tests and purifies gold—though your faith is far more precious than mere gold. So when your faith remains strong through many trials, it will bring you much praise and glory and honor on the day when Jesus Christ is revealed to the whole world." — 1 Peter 1:7 (NLT)

Growth Group 'Go Deeper' Questions

1. What is the primary thing you learned from your mom?
2. In our text, 2 Timothy 1:3-7, Paul highlights Timothy spiritual heritage, as receiving genuine faith from his mother and grandmother. Do you have a spiritual heritage? If so, please share. If not, do you intend to pass a spiritual heritage to your children, and how?
3. Read 2 Timothy 1:5 and 1 Peter 1:7. Tell of a time you placed 100% (genuine) faith in God. Was that occurrence a difficult season in your life? Do you feel God helped you through it? What was the outcome and what did you learn? Was your faith strengthen?
4. In 2 Timothy 1:3-7, Paul encouraged Timothy's to stir up the gift of God. The "gift" for Timothy was the ministry of evangelism. He was really good at preaching the Gospel and anointed by God to do it. The definition of a "gift of God" is a divine grace for success. What do you feel your "gift of God" is in your life? Why do you think that? [Help] Ephesians 4:11-12, Romans 12:6-8, 1 Corinthians 12:7-11
5. Jesus reduced the people (doubt, fear) around him in Mark 5:37-40, as he told Jairus to *"not be afraid, just believe"*. And in 2 Timothy 1:7, Paul reminded Timothy he was not given a spirit of fear by God. What do you learn from these passages about faith and fear?

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
